(Hong Kong, 29 November 2019) To enhance public experience and appreciation of good design, the Hong Kong Design Centre has launched “BODW CityProg” (or “CityProg” for short) since last year. CityProg aims to boost the design spirit of the local community and infuse the city with energy. CityProg is sparking synergy between the local creative industry, businesses and brands, and enlivening the community with unique design programmes. This year, CityProg will carry on the spirit and link up over 100 creative groups, corporates, organisations, education institutions, designers and students, to present multifarious activities all year round with its peak from November to the first quarter of next year, provoking creativity outburst throughout the city.

A Citywide Showcase of Creativity – Spreading from 7 Districts with 16 Anchor Sites

This year, CityProg is instilling creative energy in 7 local districts — Wan Chai, Sham Shui Po, Tsuen Wan, Fo Tan, To Kwa Wan, North Point and Chai Wan. The programme will join hands with 16 Anchor Sites where large-scale, authentic and creative activities with different themes will take place. They will showcase the creative charm of their neighbourhoods. Among the 7 districts, the Wan Chai and Sham Shui Po Districts will be this year’s highlights.

Design is Great @ Wan Chai — When British design meets Asian creativity

CityProg is partnering with 4 Anchor Sites in the Wan Chai District, a district known for its perfect mix of East and West. The sites include Grade II historic building 7 Mallory Street, Starstreet Precinct, Foo Tak Building and Blue House. British, Asian and local creativity will be the theme. Visitors can expect to experience “Design is Great” in these locations!

The Department for International Trade of United Kingdom will showcase the design power of England and Northern Ireland through a series of exhibitions and design installations at 7 Mallory Street. *Eco Garden*, a smart ecological public furniture exhibition and digital art exhibition *COLLATE HONG KONG* will be opened to the public. Concurrently, Hong Kong Design Centre's Design Spectrum will open its third exhibition this year, *REFINED TOUCH: CROSSOVER BETWEEN DESIGN & CRAFT*, to showcase Asian crafts, design and aesthetics, and explore the role of design and craft in connecting humans with life community.

In the Starstreet Precinct, an urban cultural oasis in Wan Chai, CityProg is supported by Swire Properties' creative advocacy in the neighbourhood. Led by White Do Lab, the programme links up neighbouring shops to present *Dark Humour in White Do — David Shrigley*. With the ‘Dark Humour’ guided tours, talks and Scottish artist David Shrigley's design works and inflatable installations scattered in the streets and alleys, the Starstreet Precinct will become an open-air gallery to pep urbanites up with classic British black humour.

In the midst of hustle and bustle, Foo Tak Building in Wan Chai has long been a cradle for the local creative and cultural industry. Led by Art and Culture Outreach, more than 10 creative and cultural units in the buildings will present “The Door of Teleportation — Foo Tak Building Cultural Festival”. The public will be invited to push open the old building's drab-looking gate, and be “teleported” and drawn into a galaxy of creativity. Come appreciate works by local designers, or join cultural chit-chats, guided tours and music night. Experience the local creative power yourself. Blue House will host the “Viva Blue House Open Day” to let the public experience community life on Stone Nullah Lane. Try Blue House studio photography, kaifong-led crafts workshops and more to get a taste of close community bonding and design thinking!

RE-imagine SSP @ Sham Shui Po

In recent years, many young creatives and designers have set up their bases in the Sham Shui Po District. foreforehead on Ki Lung Street will transform a back alley of Wong Chuk Street into a white cube space to stage *The Everyday Signs in SSP* exhibition in partnership with 11 artists and designers. Through a host of flyposts ubiquitously seen on the streets, it opens an

alternative window to the district's lifestyle and vernacular aesthetics. Wontonmeen, a hostel located on Lai Chi Kok Road, initiated a collaboration with local residents, creative groups and organisations to create the '*SSP Shops Digital Directory*' which documents the life and culture in Sham Shui Po, giving those from other places a deeper look at the historic district. They will also host 'SSP Kai Fong Chit-chat' to foster community relationships, as well as guided tours and workshops for paper art and making silk quilts. Located on Shun Ning Road, Cheung Sha Wan, TEA HUB will organise programmes such as sensation drawing workshop and guided tours, as well as the *PRESERVE CRAFTSMANSHIP* Series exhibition to showcase photographic works themed the hands of artisans working in the district, revealing a different angle of Cheung Sha Wan's harmonious mix of old and new. Creative markets and cultural programmes taking place at D2 Place and the Jockey Club Creative Arts Centre will all be launched soon, all come together to celebrate the creativity of the Sham Shui Po District!

Linking the other 5 districts with stimulating programmes

Besides the programmes in Wan Chai and Sham Shui Po, those in the other 5 districts are equally unmissable! Located in the light industrial area Fo Tan, GLOs Cafe by foody will present a range of activities related to local design, including a series of exhibitions, story sharing sessions and workshops themed Lee Hon Kong Kai, a local Chinese calligraphy style. Local organisation Hong Kong Children & Youth Services eSm^_iley Cyber Youth Support Team is joining hands with Alex Mok, an art director in film, to give youngsters a taste of filmmaking and cultivate their creative potentials. Play Depot at To Kwa Wan's Cattle Depot Artist Village is an open and creative play space which turns industrial and domestic waste collected in the district into playful artworks. During the festival period, they will distribute '*Gwa Paper*', a publication archiving the traditional crafts and old businesses in the neighbourhood, to promote harmony and creativity in the community. Oi! in North Point will stage interactive installation exhibition *Architecture of Shade: Kinetic Playground* to explore the relationship between human and space. Chai Wan's Youth Square Y Loft will organise '*Garden of the Artisan Festival*' to gather more than 60 young artists, art groups and students from local and over the world to curate their own exhibitions, filling the neighbourhood with an artistic vibe. *(Please refer to Appendix 1 for more details of the Anchor Site Festivals.)*

Design EduVation

In addition to the events taking place in the Anchor Sites, the Hong Kong Design Centre joins hands with several organisations to organise a series of design thinking education targeting at people of different ages and backgrounds. They aim to foster the design awareness and thinking of practising architects, young designers, students and seniors. Sham Shui Po's art space

openground will hold ‘#CITY’ workshops, street exhibitions and talks to use hashtags, a popular searching tools on social media, to lead the participants to recover the missing linkage hidden in communities and explore different ways of creating a way-finding system. Aiming to raise the public’s understanding of ageing in the face of the ageing population, Enable Foundation uses innovative methods to let participants experience being old, help them understand the needs of the elderly and use user-centred design to tackle social issues. The American Institute of Architects Hong Kong Chapter works with the Hong Kong Institute of Architects and the Royal Institute of British Architects Hong Kong Chapter to co-organise the ‘Smart City’ series and stimulate design thinking through a design competition centred around reimagining the possibilities and sustainability of Hong Kong’s phone booths with creativity, technology, urban planning, etc. SOSO Enterprise teams up with THY Audiovisual Laboratory to curate ‘Design Form Festival’ to explore different forms of art, design and performance and demonstrate how design thinking and different design disciplines affect the relationship between people and improve the quality of life. *(Please refer to appendix 2 for more details of the Design EduVation.)*

100+ Satellite Events covering all corners of Hong Kong with endless creative messages

Furthermore, CityProg partners up with design businesses, brands, education institutions and consulates to bring more than 100 satellite events to the public. The programmes include playful design installations, creative markets, workshops and exhibitions to offer fun design experience for people of different ages and backgrounds and inspire design thinking in them.

Highlights of Satellite Events (Please refer to appendix 3 for more details):

- Design District Hong Kong (#ddHK) — Taking the themes of local comics and pop culture, it transforms trams, tram stops and even the Victoria Park into spaces for design and creativity, turning Causeway Bay into a district-wide playspace. London designer Camille Walala has teamed up with Hong Kong creative group Hattrick Creative to crossover British pop culture and local creativity. They will transform Victoria Park into a whimsical and visually impactful British mansion-themed design installation. It gives the urban refuge a surprising touch, defying the stereotype of leisure space and realising the limitless possibilities of public space.
- SWED Talk: Designing a Sustainable Future — Sweden has been a leader in the areas of innovation and sustainability. In this SWED Talk, the participants will explore how innovative design can create a sustainable future.
- ESF Design Day 2019 — A group of design professionals will be invited to share their passion, innovation, knowledge and daily practices with students. The programme is

centred around creating a life-long learning experience for students, guiding them to build their knowledge in art, design and business.

- Wan Chai Under the Sketching Pens and Camera Lens— Art group Urban Sketchers Hong Kong will lead participants to sketch the cityscapes of Wan Chai at different spots and appreciate every corner of the district through speed sketching and cameras.
- Neighbourhood Innovation Lab — A number of local organisations co-organise a series of Neighbourhood Fieldtrip for visiting old businesses, street stalls, new shops, art galleries, etc, to open a window to the changes in communities.
- Leather Aprons for the Future — This exhibition staged by Luen Cheong Leather will showcase 100 pieces of aprons to demonstrate the impact of leather aprons on businesses and the importance of customisation.
- Roof Market — Sheung Wan's Makee works with 10 local shops and brands to present a market featuring interesting items, including desserts, accessories, ceramics, antique props, etc.
